# Carl Moyer Program

- ▶ Carl Moyer, FARMER and SOON Programs provide funding for cleaner-than-required heavy-duty engines/equipment
- ▶ 25<sup>th</sup> year of implementation supporting deployment of advanced, cleaner technologies and air quality goals



# 24 Years - Historic Summary



South Coast AQMD has successfully provided over \$570 Million Dollars in incentives through the Carl Moyer Program



Funded 8700 On- and Off-road Vehicles



Reduced a total of 10,100 tons/year of weighted NO<sub>x</sub>, ROG & PM emissions in the South Coast Air Basin

# Program Information

- ▶ Replacement of gasoline- or diesel-powered commercial lawn and garden equipment with Electric zero-emission equipment
- ▶ Who is eligible?
  - ▶ Commercial gardeners and Landscapers
  - ▶ Local governments
  - ▶ School district, colleges and non-profits
- ▶ Must have operable gasoline or diesel-powered commercial lawn and garden equipment to scrap



# Historical Funding- L&G Equipment Replaced



South Coast AQMD has successfully provided over \$4 million in incentives in the Commercial Electric Lawn & Garden Equipment Exchange Program



Funded over 7,300 electric zero-emission lawn and garden equipment



Reduced a total of 197 tons/year of emissions in the South Coast Air Basin

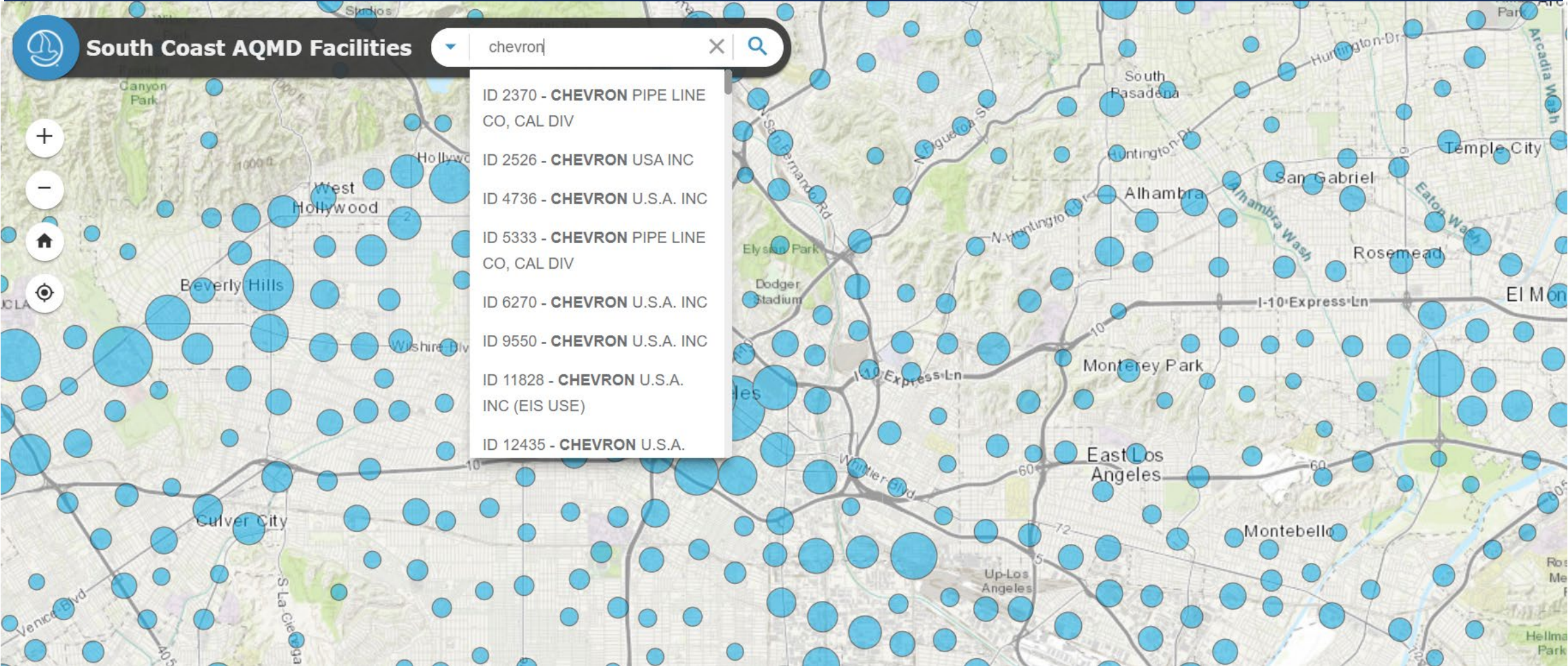

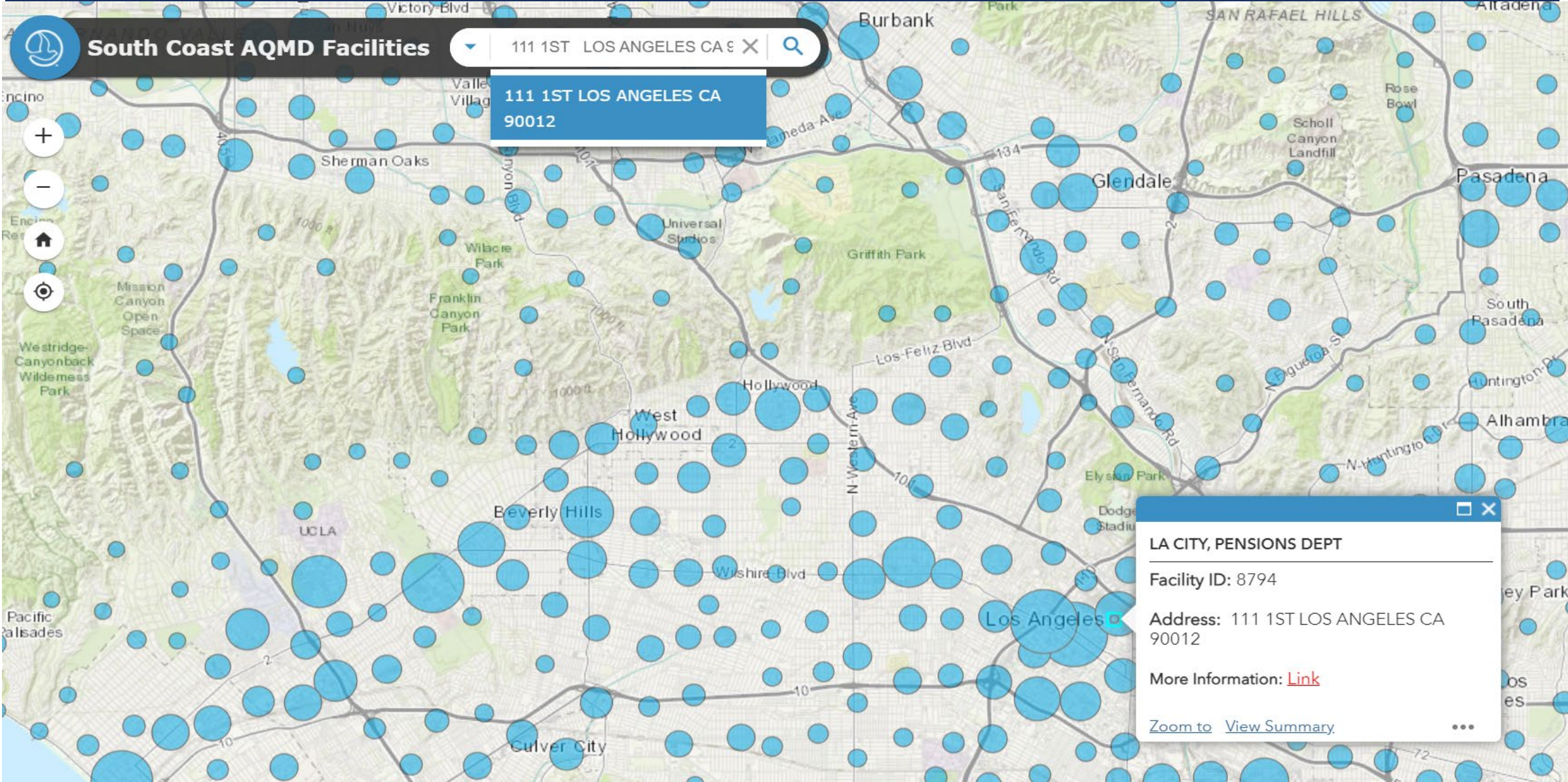

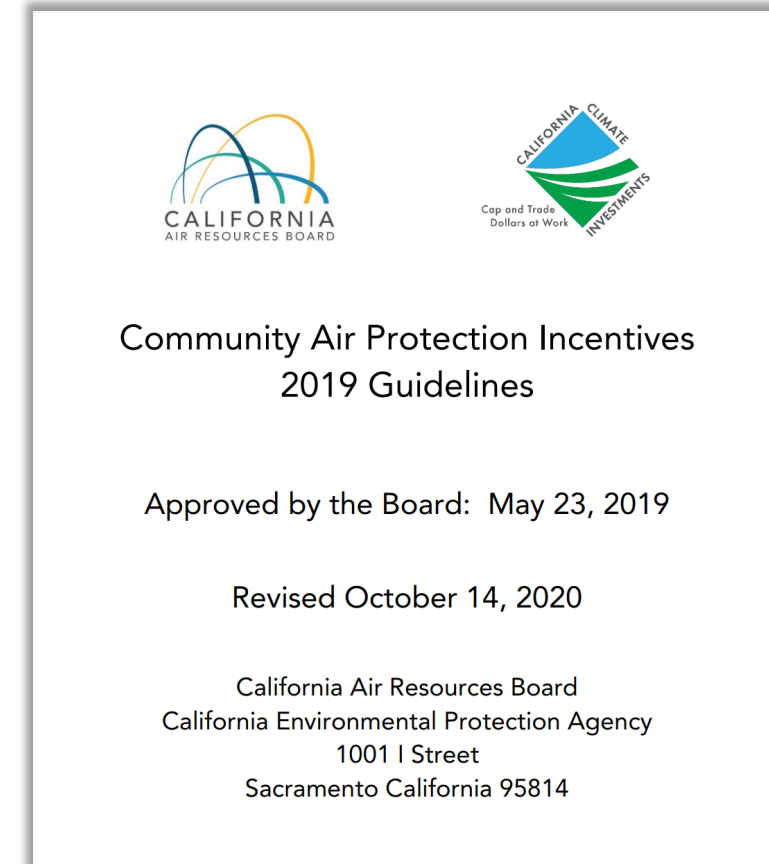
# COMMUNITY AIR PROTECTION (CAP) INCENTIVES – BACKGROUND

- SELA was allocated \$10M in Year 3 CAP incentive funds (Fiscal Year 2019-2020) for community-identified projects
- March & April 2021\*: CSC prioritized and allocated CAPP funding for:
  1. **Trucks** (\$5M)
  2. **Green spaces** (\$2.5M)
  3. **School air filtration systems** (\$2.5M)
- Community-identified projects must adhere to the Community Air Protection Incentives 2019 Guidelines



# GUIDELINES FOR CAP INCENTIVE PROJECTS

- CAP Incentives 2019 Guidelines\*: Provides guiding principles, administration requirements, and eligibility criteria for specific types of incentive projects
  - Updated October 2020 to include community-identified projects
- CAPP Incentive Project Plans: Community-identified projects are required to have a project plan consistent with:
  - CAPP Incentives 2019 Guidelines
  - California Climate Investments
  - AB 617 and other legislative requirements

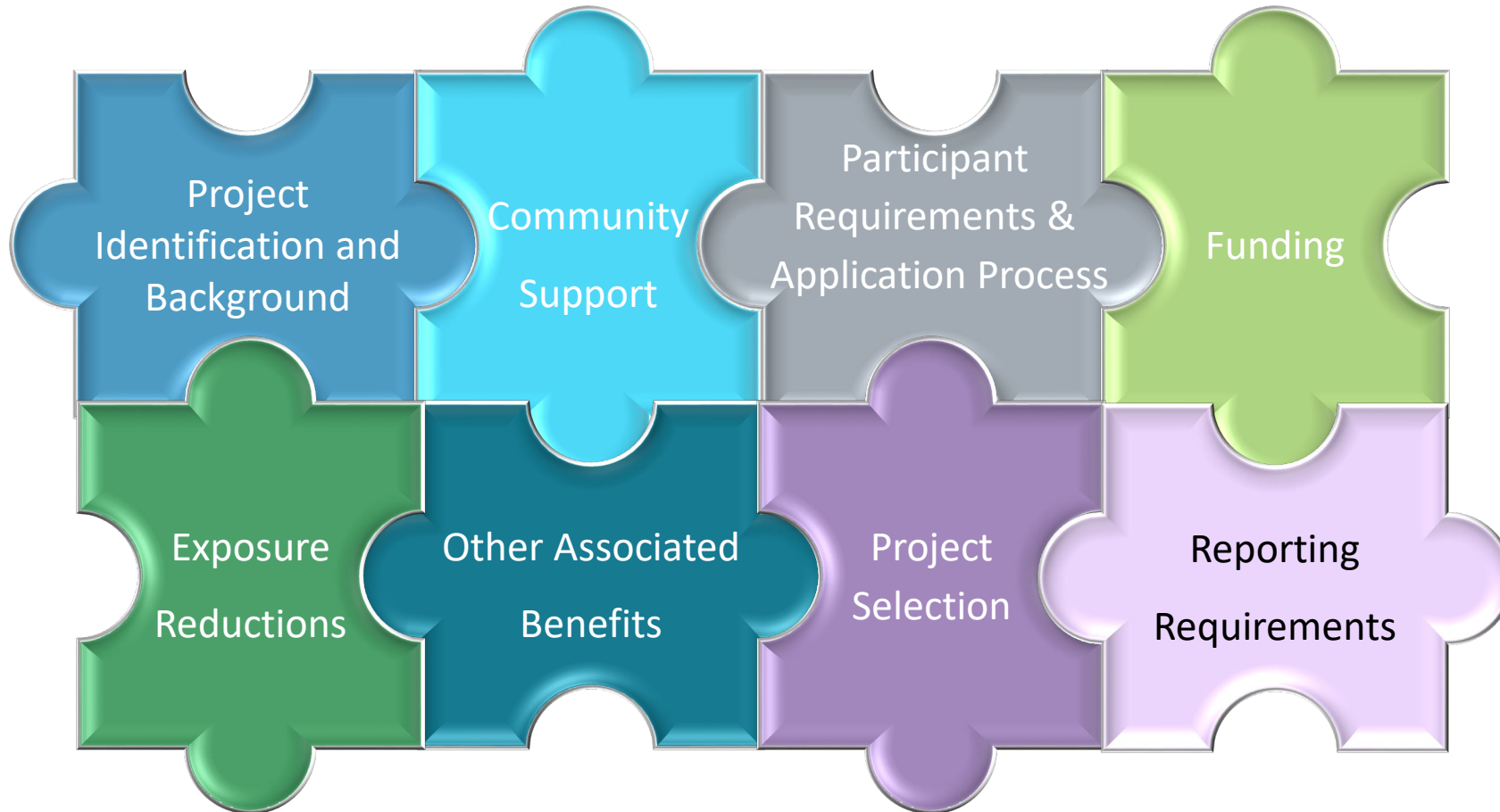

# CSC AND CARB FEEDBACK

- South Coast AQMD met\* with CSC members to receive feedback and understand the process for implementing green space projects
  - CSC members prioritized:
    - Access to recreational opportunities
    - Reductions in air pollution exposure
- South Coast AQMD and CARB Scoping Meeting in February 2023
  - CARB encouraged project plan flexibility to meet community priorities
  - CARB requested explanations for certain project plan details (e.g., project selection, quantification of benefits, etc.)



\* April and December 2021, and March and August 2022



# REQUIREMENTS AND PRIORITIES IN GREEN SPACE PROJECT PLAN

## Participant/Project Requirements

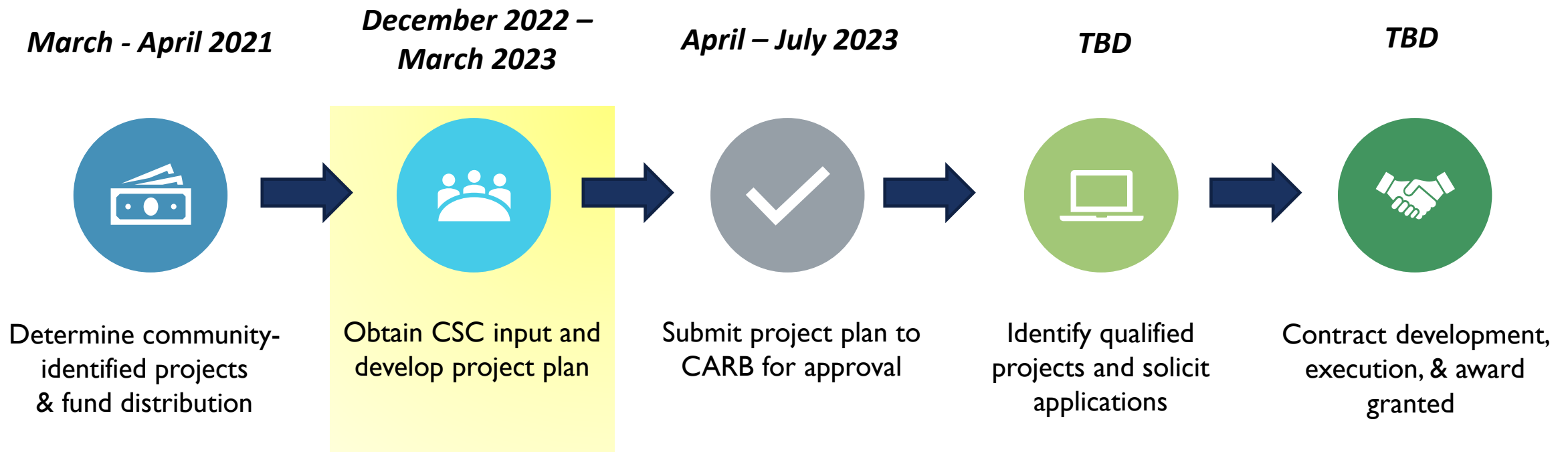
- Be an entity (e.g., public agency, non-profit/community organization, tribal government)
- Be the owner of, or have the authority/permission, to install green space(s) at the project area(s)
- Have the financial capacity to complete and maintain the green space project for five years
- Increase community tree canopy coverage by planting low-VOC, drought-tolerant, pollutant-trapping trees
- Demonstrate compliance with CEQA/NEPA\*, South Coast AQMD rules, and other local, state and federal rules/regulations

## Additional Considerations

- Increase or enhance recreational opportunities and tree canopy
- Optimize utilization of funds to be most cost-effective
- Encourage groups to collaborate and submit a single application to increase scalability and efficiency

NEPA: National Environmental Policy Act

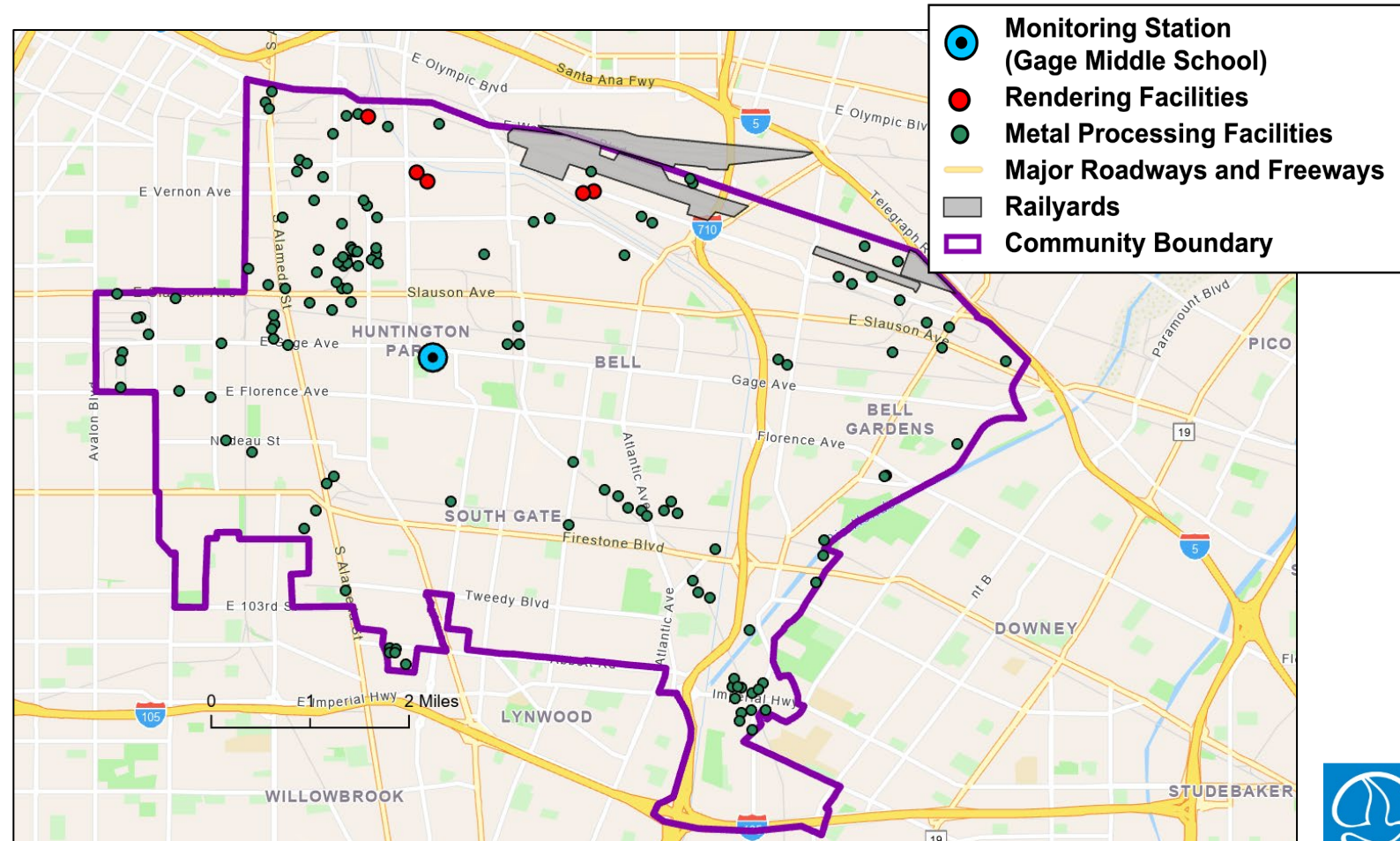

  - Ultrafine particulate matter (UFP)
  - Fine particulate matter (PM<sub>2.5</sub>)
  - Coarse particulate matter (PM<sub>10</sub>)

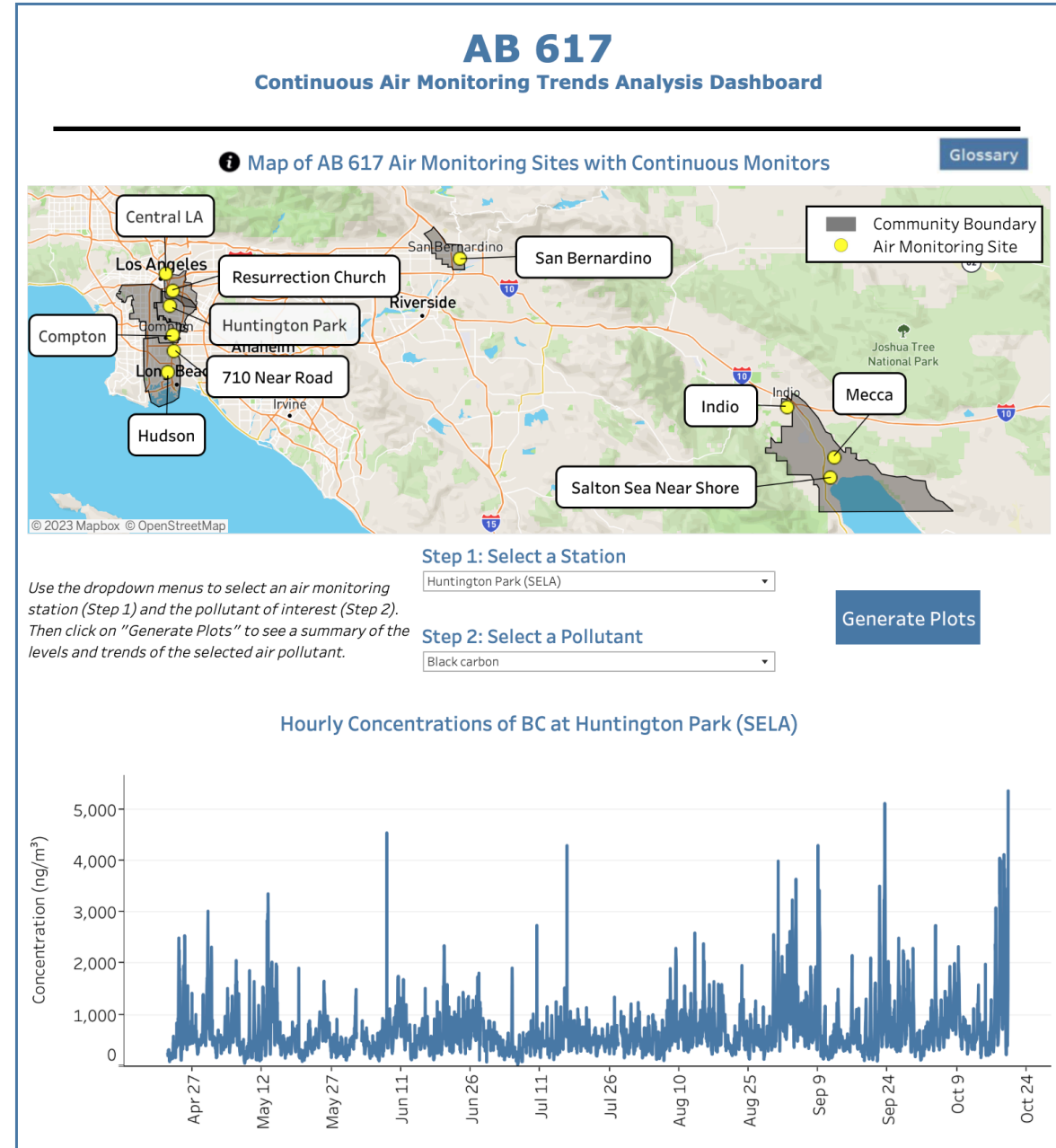
