I truly believe that banning MHF alkylation will lead to closure of a couple of refineries in the LA Basin and lead to overall negative impacts to the quality of life of those living in the Southern California area. I am not concerned with the safety issues associated with the chemical, I put trust in the CSB and ToRC.

My email is to discuss SCAQMD Proposed Rule 1410.

**Please DO NOT approve this rule.**

SCAQMD Proposed Rule 1410 Threatens Viability of Two SoCal Refineries and I believe will Cost Californians Billions.

Banning MHF would likely cause the Torrance and Wilmington Refineries to cease operations, which could devastate California's economy and could result in thousands of local jobs lost and higher prices for gasoline and consumer goods for all Californians.

Some problems that this will cause are:

- 30% of the jet fuel for LAX LOST
- 25c per gallon gasoline price INCREASE
- 2000 local jobs and thousands of indirect jobs LOST
- 80% of the marine diesel for ships at SoCal Ports LOST
- 30% of Southern California's gas supply LOST

Again, let me re-iterate, **I oppose any ban or phase-out of MHF alkylation.**
